6 THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

about working in a Peraton office during COVID-19

Coming to work is going to be different for all of us now. As an employee, you must take personal action to limit the spread of COVID-19 to keep your colleagues safe.



If you can work from home, it is expected that you work from home.



Facecoverings are mandatory in hallways, open or shared workspaces (cubicles), and common areas.



Regular handwashing is required.



Social distancing (6 feet or 2 meters) is mandatory at all times, even in meetings.



Areas of your facility may be temporarily closed for health and safety (i.e. kitchens, gathering spaces).



You are required to follow posted guidance throughout Peraton facilities.
